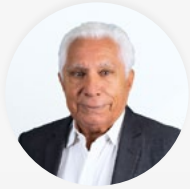

Maurice Tchenio

Co-founder of Apax, one of the world's leading Private Equity firms, and pioneer of Venture Philanthropy in France. Over 25 years of track record as Chairman of a listed fund of funds.

Chief Executive Officer of Altaroc Partners (formerly Amboise Partners), Maurice Tchenio also serves as Chairman of Altamir Gérance and President of the AlphaOmega Foundation.

Maurice Tchenio began his career as an assistant professor of finance at HEC, then as a project officer at the Institut de Développement Industriel (IDI) in Paris, an investment bank specialising in equity investments. In 1972, together with Ronald Cohen and Alan Patricof, he co-founded Apax Partners, today one of the world's leading Private Equity firms.

From 1972 to 2010, he served as Chairman and CEO of Apax Partners SA, the French arm of the Group. In 1995, he founded Altamir, a listed Private Equity company. In 2010, he established AlphaOmega, a venture philanthropy foundation recognised as being of public utility.

He is a co-founder of the AFIC (Association Française des Investisseurs pour la Croissance, rebranded as France Invest in 2018) and a former board member of the EVCA (European Private Equity and Venture Capital Association, now Invest Europe). Maurice Tchenio holds degrees from HEC and Harvard Business School, where he graduated as a Baker Scholar with high distinction.
